A	Project Brief The panel will evaluate: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> the quality of the proposed project/activity (10%). the importance and relevance of the issue(s) it wishes to address (10%). beneficiaries of the project (10%). the strength of the idea presented (10%). Proposals with well-defined objectives and measurable outcomes will be prioritized.	40%
B	Alignment with The Physiological Society's Equity, Inclusion and Diversity Roadmap The panel will be looking for a clear grasp and strong evidence of the fund's aims in: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> how the project/activity will contribute to removing barriers to participation in the Physiology community (10%). promoting an inclusive research and/or teaching culture within Physiology (10%). 	20%
C	Project Costs The panel will be considering: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> if the costs of the project/activity are reasonable for the scale of the outcomes and impacts outlined (10%). if there is evidence of careful consideration given to cost-effectiveness (10%). 	20%
D	Impact Assessment The panel will be looking for an appropriate mechanism to measure the success and impact of the project outcomes.	10%
E	Sustainability The panel will be looking for evidence that the project can demonstrate long-term sustainability by incorporating strategies and practices that ensure its continued effectiveness, relevance, and impact beyond the initial implementation phase.	10%
